#### Wrap-Around Care Booking System

As you are now aware, the school will take over the management of the wrap-around care from Monday  $2^{\rm nd}$  January 2023. Bookings are available from Wednesday  $4^{\rm th}$  January 2023.

We are offering 3 sessions each day: -

- Breakfast Club 7:30 8:45 am £5.50 (including breakfast)
- After School Club Session 1 3:10 4:15 pm £4.50 (Snack included)
  After School Club Session 2 4:15 5:30 pm £6.50 (Light Tea Included)

If you would like to book your child into our wrap-around care, you can do so via your parent pay account (instructions are attached). Please ensure you book early as places are limited. If your child has any special dietary requirements or allergies, please fill in the special dietary forms attached to this email.

If you would like to use childcare vouchers to pay for your wrap-around care, please contact the school office directly.

#### Making bookings

- 1. Go to www.parentpay.com and log in
- Select the child to make booki
   Select Book Meals and places
- 4. Select the booking you wish to make e.g. Breakfast, ASC Session 1 or After School (Session 2) and the time of day that you wish to make a booking for
- 5. Select the week to view
- 6. Select Make or view bookings

7. You will then be presented with a booking screen. Schools can opt for varying functionality, so you will see the following formats:

- ASC Session 1
- After School (Session 2)
- 8. Make the required bookings

). A summary will be displayed at the bottom of the page with any previous unpaid bookings shown in red

WARNING: Any bookings must be confirmed and paid for within 2 hours of selecting them. Failure to do so will result in the bookings being automatically cancelled

10. Review the booking summary, and select Confirm booking.

11. Any credit in your Parent Account will be used to pay for the meals. Any remaining cost can be paid by Bank Transfer (if enabled), Visa Checkout or Other payment methods



#### School Attendance

We are monitoring attendance every two weeks, focusing on children whose overall attendance is below 90%. We will invite parents to an absence review meeting if the attendance is below 85% and we have not previously discussed it with you.

Any leave of absence during term time will only be granted in 'exceptional circumstances'. In the Education Act the Department for Education states: every day at school counts enormously and so does every consecutive day attended by pupils. Pupils need to be able to absorb new facts and knowledge, acquire new skills and consolidate before building further and progressing. They simply cannot do so if their structured school terms are disrupted by too many preventable absences.

If the absence has not been authorised by the school and an absence occurs, where the child's total unauthorised absences amounts to 10 or more sessions (5 school days), continuous or aggregated within the previous six months within the current academic year (including the most recent unauthorised absence), schools are expected to notify the Education Welfare Service.

We will notify you by letter if your child's unauthorised absences amount to 10 sessions or more and a notification has been made. A regular check is made on attendance for all pupils and if a pupil's attendance falls below 90% there will be a follow up from the school.

The Educational Welfare Service have made it clear that if children are taken on holiday in term time because of their need to go on holiday at a quieter time, medical evidence will need to be provided with an application form for absence.

#### **Absence Reporting**

If your child is ill please can you ensure you call the school office on 01249 653537 to report any absences on **EACH DAY** of absence. You may also wish to update their teacher via Class Dojo as well as informing the office.

We are aware of an increase in cases of covid in the school community over the past couple of weeks, along with strep A and flu infections, so please remain vigilant.

St Peter's C of E is now a cashless school. All trips, clubs and events will need to be paid for through your ParentPay account.

We will also be using ParentPay more to communicate with parents, so please ensure that your account is set up and running.



#### Flu and Covid Update

Flu and coronavirus (COVID-19) are <u>currently circulating at high levels</u> and are present in the school community. Nationally, high numbers of scarlet fever, which is caused by group A streptococcus, also <u>continue to be reported</u>.

Professor Susan Hopkins, Chief Medical Adviser at the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA), said:

It's important to minimise the spread of infection in schools and other education and childcare settings as much as possible. If your child is unwell and has a fever, they should stay home from school or nursery until they feel better and the fever has resolved.

Helping children to learn about the importance of good hand hygiene is also key, so practice regular handwashing at home with soap and warm water. Catching coughs and sneezes in tissues then binning them is another simple way to help stop illness from spreading.

Adults should also try to stay home when unwell and if you do have to go out, wear a face covering. When unwell don't visit healthcare settings or visit vulnerable people unless urgent.

Remember that flu vaccination is still available for all eligible groups and is the best protection against the virus. We have seen good uptake in older age groups but vaccination among young children remains low. Flu can be very unpleasant and in some cases can lead to more serious illness. Getting your child vaccinated protects them and others they come into contact with, and it's still not too late.

Eligible children include:

- those aged 2 and 3 on 31 August 2022
- all primary school-aged children
- some secondary school-aged children
